The story plays itself out happily, with the simple honesty worthy of early Italian neorealism. 90min. IT Awarded by Nastro Argento.

An enterprising woman goes from fruit vending to black-market trading, only to be duped by a slick con man. A highly caricaturized piece, with fast quips, tears, happy times and singing of old hit tunes. The lady goes from rags to riches (easy money) and then back to the "faithful comforts" of her friendly fruits and vegetables. 93min. IT Awarded by two Nastro Argento.




Adamo ed Eva (Adam and Eve)

In this sentimental comedy, a hairdresser, Adamo, is engaged to a manicurist, Eva. Noting a cooling down on his part, she demands an explanation. He admits having been influenced by reading of the disasters women had caused through the ages: Eve, Helen of Troy, Cleopatra, etc., etc. But in the end they decide to face the difficulties of life together. 90 min. IT Awarded with Palme d'Oro at Cannes Film Festival and Nastro Argento.

Then Akiko, a Japanese sweetheart, arrives resenting a letter of introduction: she's the dying husband's illegitimate child. The outcome is a family and neighborhood soap opera with all the trimmings. Ottavia has meanwhile softened, coming to Akiko's aid, and vice versa when the sweet girl pulls out her Asiatic martial arts training, downing the local bullies. Both women triumph, marrying the right suitors. 99 min. IT Was awarded with Nastro Argento and nominated for Oscar as Best foreign film.




Their house bombed, a young singing teacher and her dying mother take refuge in a makeshift camp. Penniless, the woman looks for work, but runs into a young man who ends up seducing her (in the Hotel Luna), but whom she, in turn, robs before running off. Once back at the camp she finds her mother has died. A friendly, young composer offers her work singing. She begins making headway, when suddenly she's accused of murdering her ex-lover-seducer. A classic melodrama, popular in the late 40s, using war-torn Italy as a background. 85 min. IT Oscar for the best script, Palme d'Oro at Cannes Film Festival and 3 Nastri d'Argento.

A documentary, sponsored by the Italian Navy, based on a mission of the submarine 'Enrico Toti' during the second World War. The plot initially centers on the tensions of several crew members before they return to action. Once back, the 'Enrico Toti' is engaged in hide-and-seek strategy with enemy subs and subjected to antisubmarine bombings. Later, trapped, in a highly dramatic sequence, Captain and crew are sacrificed as they ram and sink a hostile submarine. The film was shown at the Venice Film Festival (1942). 80 min. IT International Film Chamber Award at Venice Film Festival, Nastro d'Argentro.

Amanti senza amore (Unloving Lovers)

Piero and Nora marry, but soon find that sex is their only common denominator. Not even the birth of a daughter helps their tormented relationship. When a violinist friend of Piero's shows an interest in Nora, the husband's unsuspected jealousy suddenly comes to fore, further eroding their marriage. One day, discovering the Violinist secretly visiting his wife, Piero is driven mad and spews his raging possessiveness by eventually killing Nora and himself. The film is a dramatic reworking of Tolstoy's "Kreutzer Sonata". IT Awarded with David Donatello.

Un Americano in vacanza (A Yank in Rome)

Italy during the occupation of Allied Forces at the end of World War II. The encounter of an Italian girl and a GI on leave. The setting is Rome: rampant poverty; girls hawking from doorways. Much of the story unfolds with juxtapositioning the tenderness of the two against the decadence and shambles that surrounds them. Off-color banter and despondent situations are well balanced, and tastefully complemented by the music of Nino Rota. 99min. IT Siver Lion at Venice Film Festival, Grolla D'oro for the best film, 2 Nastri d'Argento.

Police Commissioner, Pietrangeli, by sheer chance finds himself investigating the death of a young woman killed in his own condominium. When he arrests Aldo, the dead woman's separated husband, the Commissioner's own daughter confesses that she loves the man and that he was with her at the moment of the crime. Circumstantial evidence presses Pietrangeli to declare his daughter as the main suspect, but the truth unravels and triumphs in the end. 90 min. IT Oscar for the best foreign film, Special jury award at Venice Film Festival, David di Donatello.

Neglected by her journalist husband, Annalisa resorts to a double life: having returned to her university studies, she meets and bigamously marries her psychology professor. This leads a sparkling Monica Vitti through a series of comical situations as she juggles her two marriages... until the day she finds herself pregnant! She arranges a meeting between the two men who become friends. When they are finally confronted with her condition, the three decide to maintain the status quo. She will, of course, deliver twins. An Italian box office hit, the film has an element of funky feminist freshness. 100 min. IT Awarded with David di Donatello.

The rendering of Giordano's opera Andrea Chenier in a lavish cinema showcase: two rivals in love, Andrea and Gerard, find themselves on opposite sides during the French Revolution. Gerard has his opponent brought before the Revolutionary Committee where he is condemned. The characters are played by professional actors (mouthing the arias). The opera is masterfully conducted by Franco Ferrara. 110 min. IT/FR Two David di Donatello, Grolla d'Oro and two Nastri d'Argento.

In a hospital, a young nun (Anna), while nursing a severe casualty patient, recognizes the young man she was to marry. While he undergoes surgery, her thoughts flashback to when she was a nightclub dancer, and bartender Walter's lover: a cynical, callused individual, the exact opposite of Andrea (now battling between life and death). Coming out of her "reverie", Anna is caught between the reawakening of her love and her religious vows. Andrea begs her to marry him. She's about to give in when a disastrous rail accident fills the hospital with wounded passengers. Her duty prevails, and, however sufferingly, she give up the dreams of her past. 108 min. IT Awarded with Nastro d'Argento.

This documentary reconstructs scenes from the lives of the inhabitants of a small Italian village, showing us the atavistic customs and impoverished life style of the community. Director Piccon neither condemns the existing order, nor offers solutions. His is a simple and loving statement of fact, but not without ironic moments. Winner of the "Targa Leone di San Marco" at the XXVI Venice Film Festival. 87 min. IT Also awarded with Silver Bear at Berlin Film Festival, Grolla d'Oro for the best film and 3 Nastri d'Argento.

Following an automobile accident, a beautiful woman takes refuge for the night in the boathouse of a Po River ferryman. He is so taken up by her wiles that he leaves his common-law wife, her child and mother to search for his "true love" in Rome, only to discover that hers was but a momentary whim. Coming to his senses, he will return to the sure "moorings" of his background. The film successfully recreates the stolid Po Valley atmosphere and the candid sentiments of its protagonist. 85 min. IT Palme d'Oro at Cannes Film Festival, 2 David di Donatello and 4 Nastri d'Argento.

This colossal, historic film tells of the deeds of Attila and his Huns as they swooped through northern Europe, cutting down whomever dared oppose them. Only the proverbial mettle of Pope Leo I will convince Attila to quit his devastating plunder of the Italian peninsular. Sophia Loren and Irene Papas complement an imposing Anthony Quinn in this film made when Rome was forcing Hollywood to take notice. 100 min. IT Awarded with Grolla d'Oro.

La Ballerina e il Buon Dio (The Ballerina and the Boy)

A six year-old orphan, Marietto, searches for a ballerina (Camilla) whose poster he idolizes. He finally sees her rehearsing in a theatre, and follows her home. The young girl reluctantly takes him in, only to abandon him later. He tags after two itinerant acrobats. Later, Camilla has a change of heart and goes looking for the boy. She catches sight of him walking perilously on a tightrope. Marietto keeps his balance, and is embraced by all. However sentimental, the story has a certain grace, with the added boon of Vittorio De Sica in several cameo roles. 102 min. IT Oscar nomination for the best foreign film, 2 Nastri d'Argento.



Bambini ci guardano (Children Watch Us)

A wife runs off with a lover, abandoning her faithful husband and Pric, a sensitive child. The husband takes her back, only to be abandoned again. The second desertion is too much for his poor heart. He commits suicide. The child is an inescapable witness, exposed so early to the evils of life. Based on the novel "Pric" by Cesare Giulio Viola, the film, a cornerstone of Italian neorealism, marks the first collaboration between scriptwriter Cesare Zavattini and director Vittorio De Sica. 90 min. IT Awarded with 3 Nastri d'Argento.

Il Bandito (The Bandit)

Returning home, an Italian prisoner of war learns that his mother died in the bombing of their house. Only a sister survived. After much searching, he finds her in a brothel with a man. They quarrel, they fight, and the man dies in the fray. The brother takes refuge in the house of a woman who involves him with a gang of thieves. The police finally corner him and, in the attempt to shield a little girl, he is shot. This realistic drama, featuring a forceful Anna Magnani, reveals shades of Howard Hawks. 87 min. IT





La Bella di Roma (Rome's Little Darling)

Lovely Nannina (Silvana Pampanini, the beauty of the title) is wooed by three men: Mario, a boxer, her first choice, who ends up in jail; Oreste, a widower and owner of a bar; and Gracco, an upholsterer, the local ladies' man (an engaging Alberto Sordi). Gracco is on the verge of winning her favors when circumstances deter him just in time for Mario the boxer to reappear and win her hand. A showcase for some of Italy's finest actor-comedians with a spirited musical score by Nina Rota. 99 min. IT

This story of a gay couple (Domenico and Antonio), the screen adaptation of a successful stage play, centers around the conflict that arises when Antonio disrupts their well-ordered lives by bringing home a young male model, creating a "m,nage a trois". The interloper will eventually settle in with his girlfriend (with a little help from Domenico) and domestic harmony will again bless the gay couple. The situations are treated with some levity, but without needless condescension and without the total dementia of a "La Cage aux Folles". 95 min. IT





Il Birichino di papà... (Daddy's Little Devil)


Nicoletta, a spoiled, impulsive teenager, is sent off to a strict boarding school by her usually overindulgent father. But even there she manages to disrupt the disciplined atmosphere of the school. She has reason to believe that her brother-in-law is cheating on her sister, and the two come up with a plan that can only lead to disaster... but all works out for the best. The bubbly quality of the lead, and the boarding-school atmosphere, make this a madcap, fun-filled caper. 80 min. IT



Il Bravo di Venezia (The Secret Executioner)

This period film, skillfully shot, represents a fine example in its genre. The drama centers around a nobleman, turned bandit, who evades the death penalty by agreeing to become a secret executioner for the Council of Ten... until he is told to execute his own son. He sacrifices his life to save the young man (who is later, proved innocent), thus being free to marry his betrothed. The leads: Rossano Brazzi and Valentina Cortese convincingly portray the romantic lovers. 85 min. IT



Il Brigante di Tacca del Lupo (The Brigand)

Italy, 1870, shortly after the country's unification: a Captain ordered to capture the brigand, Raffa Raffa, meets with the objection of the local Chief of Police. The Captain advocates energetic action, while the later prefers waiting for a more propitious moment. A platoon is sent out in search of Raffa Raffa, but at the cost of many lives. The mission will be accomplished thanks to the help of a young woman (formerly "dishonored" by the Brigand) who will help the Captain to uncover Raffa's stronghold. The film, masterfully directed by Pietro Germi (scripted together with Federico Fellini) confronts the timeless dilemma of individual conscience and State law. 97 min. IT

Caccia tragica (Tragic Manhunt)

The Po River Valley, 1945: the robbery of pay envelopes and murder by an unemployed war veteran and his mistress, plus the kidnapping of a hostage, Daniela (Vivi Gioi), incurs the wrath of the local factory workers. When the workers finally corner the outlaws, they single out the murderer, but only pelt him with mud, a form of symbolic punishment, of dying many times over. This highly factional film won the "Nastro D'Argento" (Italy's Oscar equivalent) for best director and best actress. It also won recognition at the VIII Venice Film Festival. Michelangelo Antonioni and Cesare Zavattini were co-writers 80 min. IT



He's saved by the wiles of his clever young son and the grateful passengers he's faithfully served through the years. Humorous and profound, this bittersweet tale (a'la "Bread and Chocolate") presents us with a workingclass hero doing the best he can in the worst of circumstances. 100 min. The film is told simply and effectively though the eyes of Camilla, a middle-aged country woman hired by a doctor to look after his children. The family barely gets by on the man's modest, general practitioner earnings. He tries other business schemes only to fall back on his one-and-only calling: Medicine. The film is certainly dated, but the script co-authored by Luciano Emmer, Ennio Flaiano and Rodolfo Sonego stands the test of time. 108 min. IT

A Sicilian sulfur mine, the only source of income for the townspeople, is closed down. Destitute, the younger miners finally decide to immigrate to France. Their plight is laden with obstacles, not the least of which their lack of documents. The guide they chose to lead them bleeds them of their savings and personal conflicts arise as a result. Even the weather proves harsh. But, when they're ready to give up, the French Customs' Police take pity and let them pass the border. Director, Pietro Germi paints a grandiose sociopolitica fresco, in an atmosphere of highly tense adventure. Fellini co-scripted the screenplay. Winner of best film award Berlin Film Festival (1951), and special mention at the VI Festival of Karlovy Vary (Carlsbad, 1951), 101 min. IT

Campane a martello (Children of Change)

Augustina (lovely Gina Lollabrigida) sends her earning as a prostitute to her hometown parish priest for safekeeping. But when she returns to start life anew she finds another priest (Don Andrea) who, quite innocently, spent her money to fund an orphanage. Realizing the error, enterprising Don Andrea rings the church bells, gathers his parishioners and openly shames the mayor into compensating Augustina for her "hard earned" money. A lighthearted, frothy piece, with Lollo's beauty, and a winning performance by Eduardo de Filippo as the Don Andrea. IT




Eleonora, lovely daughter of the Governor of Famagusta, is the "swashbuckling Captain" of this adventure. Donned in man's robes, she fights the Turks (with the help of the "Lion of Damascus", a converted Christian) and frees her fiancee Marcello, who had been taken prisoner (thus saving him from the advances of the cruel and beautiful Haradya). Rich scenes, believable stunts: a classic historical drama. 85 min. IT



Il Cappotto di astrakan (The Persian Lamb Coat)

Piero (Johnny Dorelli), small-town lady's man, wins a trip to Paris. Owing to a striking resemblance to Maurice, a thief currently in prison, he is sought after by both Marie and Valentine (respectively Maurice's wife and mistress). He also unwittingly arouses the suspicion of the local Police Commissioner. The plot thickens when Piero dons Maurice's Persian lamb coat, and when he's caught making love to the man's wife. Wondering why he ever left home, Piero returns to his droll existence. Then, one day, Valentine shows up! Madcap humor is the order of the day, laced with double entendres and mistaken identities. An adult comedy carried off with a welcome touch of elegance. 105 min. IT



Carica eroica (Heroic Charge)

During World War II, an Italian cavalry regiment sent to Russia establishes friendly relations with the returning peasants of a small village. But, one day, they are ordered to the front lines. There, the Germans, skeptical of their ability, will see these brave cavalrymen charge, wave upon wave, falling to the Russians, but breaking through their ranks. The last, but glorious stand for our heroes. The film captures the humanity and valor of the courageous regiment. IT



Carosello napoletano (Neapolitan Carousel)

A street singer and his family work the byways of Naples. A burst of wind scatters their sheet music. A bittersweet portrait of Naples and the perseverance of a typical Neapolitan family, presented with taste and lighthearted ease, leaves us tearing, laughing and singing. IT





Cartagine in fiamme (Carthage in Flames)

The Punic War: Hiram, an exiled officer of the Carthaginian army, makes his way back into the city to save Salva Fulvia, a Roman woman who had earlier come to his aid. He is, however, taken prisoner, and it is she, Salva once again who will sacrifice herself for him. An action-film centered around a moving love story. This colossal a'la De Mille is among the most successful in Italian cinema history. IT



Il Cavaliere misterioso (The Mysterious Cavalier)

A compromising letter written by the Doge's wife is about to fall into the hands of Catherine the Great. Should this happen the Doge will be forced to cede Venetian possessions to the Russian Empress. The Cavalier in question is none other than Casanova, who secretly returns to his native Venice to save his brother (the Doge's secretary), unjustly accused of stealing the jeopardizing missive. This seemingly lighthearted film, with touches of irony and adventure, is pleasantly carried along by an ebullient, young Vittorio Gassman. IT



I Cavalieri della regina (The Queen's Musketeers)

Not without liberties (a guitar strumming Domenico Modugno as Athos, for one) Alexandre Dumas P,re's historical adventure of "The Three Musketeers": Aramis, Athos, and Portos, with D'Artagnan, are sent by the Queen of France to escort the Spanish Infanta to Court, only to find that she's been kidnapped by the evil Prince of Cond,. They will, of course, outwit the Queens enemies, free the Infanta and save the throne for young Louis, the future King. The film has enough pizzaz and swashbuckling to delight and amuse. 80 min. IT

Cavalleria Rusticana

The dramatic retelling of Giovanni Verga's tale (not Mascagni's opera), set in a small Sicilian village, is classical tragedy recounted with passionate realism. Santuzza, driven by her jealous love for Turiddu, tells Alfio and he kills his rival. The elements are all there: true Sicilian drama! IT

C'era un castello con 40 cani (A Castle with 40 Dogs)

Bob inherits a castle in Tuscany. His wife Giovanna sets up deluxe kennels, catering to the dogs of the local nobility. Things take a bad turn when Bob is faced with having to pay inheritance taxes. Giovanna leaves him when an industrial complex interested in buying the property sets fire to the kennels. Bob is about to give up when old Muggione (Peter Ustinov), a veterinarian, maneuvers to have the castle declared of national interest thanks to its precious frescoes. Bob is consoled by the local school teacher Violetta, while Giovanna remarries. On the whole, a sentimental comedy with its dramatic moments, valid for pleasant family viewing. 98 min. IT

A series of dramatic events allows the Lieutenant to nail the guilty party just in time to save Katy. The direction holds and the acting is convincing. 95 min. IT

Sergio fires and misses, but Andrea, irritated by his opponents obvious nonchalance, refuses to shoot and postpones his turn to some future date. Four years pass. Sergio is engaged to Mascia when Andrea reappears claiming his right to resume the duel, but then realizing the cruelty and rancor behind the action, he doesn't show up. This act of generosity will convince Mascia that Andrea is, indeed, the man she loves. Despite its happy ending, this movie (based on a Puskin short story) has a strong underlying thread of violence and vengeance. The film was shown at the Venice Film Festival (1942). 90 min. IT

Come persi la guerra (How I Lost the War)



Arminio defeats all of Kindaor's warriors in a tournament, thus winning the hand of Elsa, Sedemondo's daughter. He later becomes King. Peace reigns in the land and the Crown of Iron now sits on the rightful head. Director Blasetti puts together a film a'la Macbeth using the alchemy of passion and adventure. 106 min. IT


A man kills two shepherds, goes home and calmly sits down to dinner. His twelve year old son, Vito, is aware of what happened. The following day his whole family is murdered in turn. Once again, Vito spies the horror. His only surviving family is a brother, shepherding in the hills. There he discovers that his family had kidnapped and killed a boy his own age, Simone. This account of brutality and violence inherent in backward economies may be overdrawn, but Vito's loss of innocence is a personal tale dramatically told. 100 min. IT

The pace director Francesco Rosi sets is low-keyed but very compelling. This may be remembered as his best effort. Volonts's Levi is intelligent and moving, and the supporting cast supreme. 150 min. 



Lattuada's direction of a Gabriele D'Annunzio novel (Giovanni Episcopo) has been praised for its interpretation of the text, fine acting and realistic sets. Giovanni (Aldo Fabrizi), a modest blue-collar worker, meets Giulio Wanzer, a wheeler dealer, who introduces him to his shady friends. Giovanni falls in love with Wanzer's mistress, Ginevra. When Wanzer is forced to leave Italy, Episcopo marries the woman who bears him a child. He realizes his mistake, but stays with her for the child's sake. But when Wanzer returns, determined to reclaim Ginevra, Episcopo kills the man. The drama and passion are expressed with keen reality. 94 min. IT

Destinazione Piovarolo (Destination Poivarolo)

1922, Antonio Quaglia (played by Toto, one of Italy's finest comedians) comes in last for a job placement as a station-master and is sent to Piovarolo, a godforsaken town where only one train a day passes but without stopping. He hopes for a transfer, but does little to merit one. The years pass. He marries: a daughter is born; the Fascists come to power; the war complicates his life; but nothing has really changed for Antonio. This carousel of history, seen through the eyes of a little man in a little town, is fraught with bitter laughs on social comment. 95 min. IT

At war's end they can marry, but he discovers that she's the natural daughter of the King of Naples. High adventure with a historical background, nicely packaged. 88 min. IT

Rome is under Nazi occupation. A woman working in a printing shop learns from two anonymous letters that her lover is a German collaborator. He's been passing information about members of the Resistance whom she's in contact with, resulting in the death of one of them. She kills the man and is arrested. When Rome is liberated, an old flame of hers (himself a Resistance fighter) comes to her aid. The film, with its clinical eye for time and place, is both well directed and acted. 90 min. IT



Due milioni per un sorriso (All for a Smile)

A successful immigrant returns to Italy with the money he accumulated in America and searches for the woman whose smile he once fell in love with. Prey to unscrupulous con men, he agrees to produce a film around this love story. He hires a young director who resembles him as a youth (both played by Enrico Viarisio). The young man falls in love with a secretary while casting the film. The immigrant, moved by their happiness, parts with more of his hard-earned money and returns to America. Acting and directing will pass but the story's a bit fatuous. 75 min. IT



E' caduta una donna (A Fallen Woman)

A young woman, abandoned by her seducer, moves to the city where she gives birth to a boy. There she meets a young doctor who marries her. All is well until the man begins reproaching her for her past and rejecting the affection of her child. The woman decides to leave the boy with his paternal grandmother, but as she sees him go off, she desperately runs after him, only to be hit by a car. She dies, alone, in a hospital. Typical melodrama of its day: it has all the ingredients. 72 min. IT

A man is committed to a mental hospital for fear he might give away his riches in acts of generosity. When all is over, he meekly returns to the asylum. Philosophical and farcical, this film gives substance to a lighthearted subject.

When Felice finds work in a shoe factory, the workers strike, causing our antihero to spend six months in jail. On his release, he buys an old hurdy-gurdy but it only plays Fascist hymns, and the crowd turns on him. But he's once again saved by the ne'er-do-well. Unbeknownst to Felice, the car they ride off in is stolen. The future harbingers no good for our poor, Chaplinesque friend. 86 min. IT

Later, when she helps a man escape from prison, her husband, to avoid a scandal, wants her committed. The woman makes no attempt to compromise her ideals and is interred for the rest of her life.110 min. IT



Fantasmi a Roma (Ghosts of Rome)

The story, based on a Puskin novel is directed with meticulous care for detail. The spectacle is sure to please. "Nastro d'Argento" for the sets by Piero Filippone. IT

Later the group comes upon Torre's hideaway. In an attempt to escape, he shoots and accidentally wounds his own son. Young Fabrizio's fate is now in the hands of mere chance. The film's leitmotif is "Flight", be it of fugitives or wandering workers. The tension's high, and the action quickly paced. 95 min. IT

Carletto Po (Macario), Italian immigrant in Argentina, marries by proxy, but when he returns, his wife is dead... and learns that he's (legally) father to her little boy. Initially he shirks all responsibility, but in time comes to love little Paolino, keeping him from being used by greedy relatives seeking control of an inheritance left the boy by his natural father. Chaplin's "The Kid" may have done it first, but it didn't faze Macario's supreme performance. IT

La Montagna di cristallo (Crystal Mountain)

At war's end he resumes his career, but cannot forget his infatuation for the doctor's daughter, and writes an opera based on a legend taking place in the Dolomites, to be performed in Venice. At the opening he learns that his wife is arriving in a private plane, but she's injured in a crash landing at the edge of Crystal Mountain. This twist of fate brings the man to his senses. Despite the crashes, it's essentially a romantic movie: not a classic formula, but the fairytaled Dolomite bit is easy and nice to swallow. GB/IT

Then one day the boy's uncle appears (brother of his natural father who died in the war). Angelo is at once attracted to his Afro-American uncle. Though brokenhearted, Matteo gives up the child. The surprise ending doesn't come a gimmick, but from an innate need to know one's roots. 85 min. IT

Il Mulino del Po (The Mill on the Po)

Peasant unrest, carried to extremes by both workers and landowners, leads to violence. During one such encounter, the brother of our heroine kills her betrothed. He will turn himself in, but the damage has been done. A large socio-political fresco of the time and place, does justice to Riccardo Bacchelli's prizewinning novel. 107 min. IT





Napoleone a Sant'Elena (Sant'Elena, Piccola Isola) (Napoleon at Sant'Elena)






Nave bianca (The Hospital Ship)




Nel nome del padre (In the Nameof the Father)

The late 1950s. The setting: an exclusive, disciplined parochial boarding school. Angelo is sent there for striking his father. In this dark comedy, the boy wreaks havoc: spouting Hitlerian theories; bullying everybody and even causing the prefect to be expelled. He prods a fellow student to kill his mother; leads another to suicide; etc., etc. He makes great use of fear. Only Father Corazzo manages to oppose the boy, having realized that repressive methods are not the best answer. The crux of the film is portraying school as a microcosm of society at large that in turn exposes the fragility of all existing structures. Director Bellocchio's artistry is not questioned, but the political patina that shades most of his work could be. However, there's some truth in every view, and the film is still a must for cinephiles.. 109min. IT



One day, blinded by his infatuation, he rapes the girl. Distraught, she confides in her brother, who, one stormy night at sea, kills his stepfather claiming he died accidentally. Based on a Raffaele Viviani play, the film reveals an uncompromising directness, placing it several notches above the run-of-the-mill melodramas. IT





Paolo e Francesca (Paola and Francesco)

The story of Paolo and Francesca, star-crossed lovers: Paolo's brother, Gianciotto Malatesta, Lord of Rimini (a badly deformed man) decides to wed Francesca, noblewoman from Ravenna, thus ending the strife between the two cities. He sends Paolo to negotiate the marriage by proxy. But Paolo recognizes her as the girl who nursed him back to health after a military skirmish. They fall in love, but the marriage to Malatesta takes place as planned. Then one day he spies them kissing, and revenge is inevitable. The story is a classic. Alas, this rendering isn't. IT



Papa... Lebonnard (Papa Lebonnard)

Anna, a beautiful girl, pledges eternal love to Andrea, a sailor. However, during his long absence she is unfaithful. Desperate, she attempts suicide. Upon Andrea's return she confesses all. Enraged, he slaps her and walks off. Time passes, others propose marriage, but she remains faithful to her first love. When the two meet again, Andrea cannot forgive and leaves for good. Anna's refuge is in the bosom of her family. Strangely enough this unhappy ending holds together. A slice of drab life without a moment of boredom: good scripting, great cast, a neat film. 95 min. IT


Based on Victorian Sardou's novel: perfidious Scarpia blackmails Tosca into revealing the hiding place of an escaped political prisoner, thus saving her love, Mario Cavaradossi. But Tosca kills Scarpia, and desperately runs to what should be Cavaradossi's false execution. But he is put to death owing to Scarpia's infamous double-dealing, Tosca throws herself off the parapet of Hadrian's Tomb. A point of interest: director Jean Renoir began the film but, left the set when Italy declared war against the allies. 105 min. IT

The rivalry between two Venetian families, the Foscaris and the Faredanas is so acute that when a Foscari is elected as the Doge, the elder Faredana dies of shock and his son swears vengeance. Through false testimony, the son of the Doge is imprisoned and eventually accused of murder. At the last moment, the young man will unmask the real culprits and prove his innocence. Based on Lord Byron's historical drama, the film offers a young Rossano Brazzi (Foscari son) the opportunity to bring his Latin charm into play. Certainly, an added plus comes from Michelangelo Antonioni as co-scripter and assistant director. 85 min. IT
